**FOOTBALL TIPS: Corner: The Kick Curves In:** For the in-swing corner kick, that is one that curve in towards the goal, you should kick the ball with your left foot from the right side and with your right foot from the left side. Keep the ball away from the goalkeeper by aiming to drop it just outside the area and in line with the near post, at a height that will give your other forwards the chance of a header at goal. Even if you make an error and put the ball nearer to the far post than intended, its inward curve will give the goalkeeper a very awkward ball to deal with.
